

Genetics is the study of genes, genetic variation, and heredity in living organisms. It is generally considered a field of biology, but it intersects frequently with many of the life sciences and is strongly linked with the study of information systems.

Genetic counseling is the process by which the patients or relatives at risk of an inherited disorder are advised of the consequences and nature of the disorder, the probability of developing or transmitting it, and the options open to them in management and family planning.









TELEGENETICS EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROJECT (HRSA)

This inter-regional project was developed to offer training about telegenetics in order to increase understanding of and uptake of use of telemedicine among genetic specialists. The WSRGN helped create the foundation for increasing access to genetic services by training new providers to incorporate telemedicine as part of routine practice. This effort has been expanded to other regions that are now offered this training. Two trainings have been held as of summer 2016 with three additional trainings scheduled for 2016 and quarterly for 2017 *This is now a national program!



- Hybrid Certificate Course

- All counselors rotate thru the interactive videoconference role playing experience and participate as a counsellor as well as a patient with challenging scripts

- Genetic Counselors often deliver very BAD news!





- Nine of ten genetic counselors (90%) report they are satisfied with their job.

- The average salary for a full-time genetic counselor is \$81,377 but can reach up to \$250,000 depending on specialty area and experience.
- Employment of genetic counselors is projected to grow 29 percent by 2024, much faster than the average.


