
Innovative Telehealth Projects with Native Americans

2. Promote digital equity and inclusion through increased digital skills and access to devices for all Arizona residents including Tribal Nations and their members.
3. Create a 21st century workforce so Arizonans and Tribal Nations can succeed in the rapidly evolving job market where the state creates, grows and attracts high wage businesses to increase economic development.
4. Coordinate broadband infrastructure investments with investments in healthcare, education, public safety, workforce and economic development statewide and on tribal lands.
5. Promote broadband service pricing that is affordable to all Arizonans including Tribal Nations and their members.

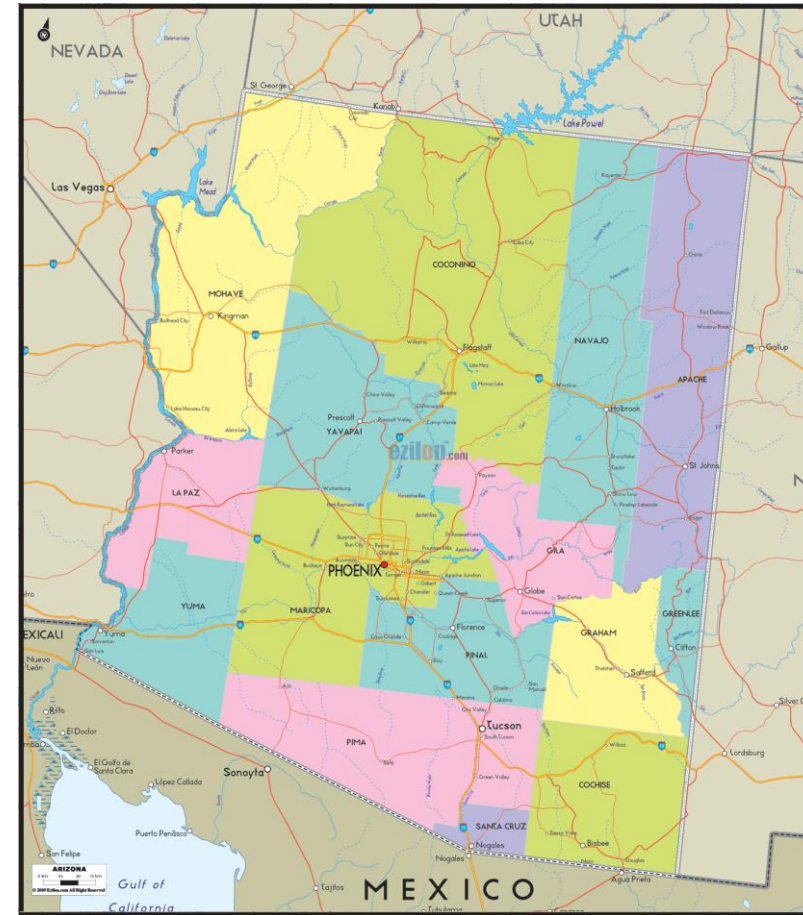

Millions of Families Rely on "Affordable Connectivity Program" for Broadband

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Today, August 17, 2023, a bipartisan group of 45 Members of Congress, 29 Democrats and 16 Republicans — led by Representatives Josh Gottheimer (NJ-5) and Brian Fitzpatrick (PA-1) — wrote to congressional leadership and called for an extension of the federal Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) in the upcoming government appropriations bill.

Unfortunately, **one in five** American households lack access to broadband. Nearly **40%** of eligible Americans rely on ACP to maintain internet access and that number is rapidly growing. Current federal investment for ACP is expected to be depleted by 2024.
