



Challenges to health care



22 officially recognized Tribes in AZ – mostly rural.

Distances - Redlake Chapter to Tuba City Regional Healthcare Walk in Clinic = 24 miles Broadband – Availability and affordability Digital Gap – Adoption issues. Needing help. Childcare- when caregivers themselves needs health-care Time-off from work

Public Libraries are in every community

Arizona Libraries – a vision for TeleHealth

 Providing Equipment: Provide Libraries with Health Kits Digital scale; blood pressure cuff; no touch thermometer); EKO stethoscope software and license; Glucometer; pulse-oximeter; weigh scale; Laptops

Providing Connectivity:

- Libraries have connectivity through E-rate funding and Navigators funded through an LSTA-IMLS project that have been assisting patrons for the past year.
- For those with small spaces in the library a privacy tent to be put up in the parking lot with WiFi availability.
- Mobile Broadband: Where possible, Mobile Vans equipped with WiFi Antennae to go out into the community with the Health kits and Nurses and provide the telehealth service.
- **Encouraging Partnerships**: The State Library is partnering with SWTRC and U of A Telehealth team and with County Health Dept. and NAU Nursing consultants to pilot a program in Pima County (Arivaca and Ajo libraries) that can be replicated throughout Arizona
- **Provide Training**: Train Navigators, partner with nursing school to get an RN and student nurses visit the libraries creating sustainability





Arizona Libraries and Health Services

Pima County Public Library one of the 1st in the country with a Registered Nurse visiting the Library 4 days a week and helping the homeless since 2012

Many libraries loan Hot Spots and I-pads to patrons to use at home.

Many libraries provide Health related information

Now 370,000 households in AZ are signed up for ACP Arizona Schools and Libraries applied for \$200 M for Hot Spots and devices

Many libraries provide Nutrition, Wellness, Fitness, Yoga Programs for adults and children And now... will provide meeting rooms and health kits for making their telehealth meetings with their Health Service Provider

Arizona: what have we done so far?

Guiding patrons to resources



These nurses help library patrons with hygiene, behavioral issues, immunizations, and substance abuse issues. They also direct people to the appropriate channels to help with healthcare, transportation, getting valid ID, or setting up appointments, as many of these individuals do not have access to a phone. They are advocates for health care and caregiver for those needing assistance.

- A partnership with U of A provides student nurses to assist patrons if needed.
- A partnership with the County Health Services provides Nurses to visit the library and assist patrons and mentor the accompanying student nurses.
- Connecting patients with Health Care providers several hundred miles away.
- Providing Navigators to help people sign up for ACA/ ACP/ devices for home use for health monitoring and more.

- Serving the unserved or underserved, who do not have broadband access at home and who are far from a hospital or health care.
- Ensuring preventive and timely care, frequent monitoring, keeping them out of the hospitals. Patients will more likely honor their appointments, if they don't have to go too far.
- Making available portable backpack kit with BP cuffs and stethoscope, digital weigh scale, diabetes monitoring. Kit available for patrons to take vitals and transmit - through a laptop via a secure licensed software to transmit to the doctor using the library's connectivity. This can be done via mobile clinics using WiFi Antenna also provided by the grant or using hotspots from Home.
- Nutrition/Wellness Training for patrons via video conferencing in the library or safely
 around the vehicle with fold-out tables and laptops.



- Extending TeleHealth Services through Libraries: Pima County was selected as they had prior experience.
- In Pima County the Ajo and Arivaca Libraries were chosen as they were rural, remote south of the check-point, where getting to health care was a challenge.
- This project was supported with LSTA funds in partnership with the Southwest Telehealth Resource Center of U of A and expert consultation from NAU.

Arivaca Health Fair Oct 2022

Pilot was inaugurated at the Arivaca Health Fair

- 120 Visitors (out of population of 629- 2020 census)
- 36 Covid Vaccines
- 26 Pima County One Stop Visits
- 22 Arizona Talking book Visits
- 23 Book Mobile Visits
- Several Live Health Screenings Demos
- 472 Community Resource Table Visits
- 15 plus partners participated

Connect-Arizona Navigators help Arizonans on their digital needs


Chicanos por la Cause promoting ACP and Help Our Kids Connect programs Talking Book Library serves people with impaired vision or people who can't hold and read a book

What next? - 1 Innovative Telehealth Projects with Native Americans

- The project on fiber and broadband to the Chapter Houses of the Navajo Nation, paid for through E-rate funding will help bring Telehealth to the Navajo and Tohono O'odham Communities in Northern Arizona.
- This project in collaboration by NIH's Native American Cancer Prevention team at NAU and supported by the LSTA grant through the State Library will use Native American Nurses and nursing students to ensure cultural sensitivity and protocols.
- The project is in the planning phase is being set up to work with the Navajo and Tohono O'odham tribes.
- Continue working with Pima County on the first pilot Telehealth Project at Ajo and Arivaca and use the lessons learned to replicate it in other libraries around the State of Arizona

The Future is here: Kiosks and Privacy Rooms



Next Steps - Self Help Health Kiosks, breast feeding rooms at airports, different models of privacy multi-purpose rooms in public places like the libraries – all with Broadband access

What next? - 3 Training Health Navigators for the future




Dr. Kim Shea, PhD. RN., training Nursing Students to help the community
