3. Understand how Tribes are deciding to reinvest their savings.

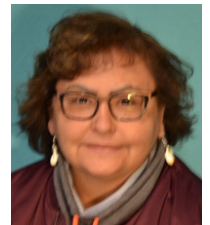


Julie Johnson, Tribal Affairs Director, Oregon Health Authority
