Most of her work supported innovation initiatives to enable people to get care anywhere and providers to provide care from anywhere. Areas of focus have included video visits, remote patient monitoring, e-visits, as well as the use of mobile apps and social media in care delivery. In all of these efforts, motivating providers to provide care differently was the most significant challenge to success.
